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UH Transfer Rules

- Courses taken at COM must be completed with a C- or better.
- A maximum of 66 lower-level transfer credits can be used towards a UH bachelor's degree.
- A maximum of 2 credit hours in physical activity courses can transfer.

Major Requirements

- **B.A. Foreign Language:** complete 6 hours of 2000-level foreign language courses. This can also be fulfilled in part or full through credit by examination.
- **CLASS Block:** complete 6 hours of CLASS coursework outside of the major subject that does not overlap with core curriculum, B.A. foreign language, major, or minor requirements. Approved subjects include ECON, ENGL (excluding 2311), GOVT, HIST, PHIL, PSYC (excluding 2314), SGNL, SOCI, or SPCH.
- **CLASS Diversity:** complete an approved diversity course. The list of approved courses can be found in the UH catalog.
- **Minor:** complete a minor or approved substitute. No more than 6 hours of major coursework can be used towards the minor.

Students who graduate with a degree in Spanish can pursue a large variety of careers and graduate programs. Recent graduates are employed in the following careers:
