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UH Transfer Rules

- Courses taken at HCC must be completed with a C- or better.
- A maximum of 66 lower-level transfer credits can be used towards a UH bachelor's degree.
- A maximum of 2 credit hours in physical activity courses can transfer.

Major Requirements

- **B.S. Math:** complete 12 hours of approved mathematics courses. Approved mathematics courses include: BUSI 2305, COSC 1436, all college-level MATH courses, PHIL 2303, or PSYC 2317. At least 6 hours must be MATH subject courses.
- **B.S. Natural Science:** complete 6 hours of core Life & Physical Science courses and an additional 2 hours in the natural sciences. Students who complete 8 hours of core Life & Physical Science courses will complete this requirement.
- **Minor:** complete a minor or approved substitute. No more than 6 hours of major coursework can be used towards the minor.
- Complete KINE 1301, KIN 3305, KIN 3360, and KIN 4355 with a C- or better.
